

LEARNING WITH LUKE 19:28-40 “TIME FOR REJOICING” P. 1044 PEW BIBLE

Luke 19:38-40 - the multitude, saying “Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!” And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, “Teacher, rebuke your disciples.” He answered, “I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out.”

However inadequately the disciples and multitude understand the significance of what is happening as Jesus rides into Jerusalem, they are right about who He is, as they hail Him the long-awaited Messianic king. -SB Ferguson

1- KING ON A COLT - fulfilling

Luke 19:28-31 - disciples
Luke 19:32-36 - divinity
Zech 9:9-17 - humble King
Genesis 49:8-12 - Judah
1 Kings 1:32-40 - mule

Jesus knew what awaited Him in Jerusalem, and He arrived not as a conquering King on a warhorse, but as the Suffering-Servant King of peace, meek and lowly and riding on a donkey, just as God had prophesied. -RC Sproul

2- ACCLAIM OF A CROWD - rejoicing

Luke 19:37-38 - multitude
Luke 2:13-14 - Glory to God
Matt 21:1-11 - hosanna
Mark 11:1-10 - blessed
2 Kings 9:1-13 - cloaks
Psalm 118:1-29 - sacrifice

Before giving Himself as a sacrifice, Jesus drew the attention of the whole nation to Himself. The Lamb of God was about to be slain. The great sin offering was about to be killed. All the eyes of Israel should be fixed on Him. -JC Ryle

3- CRITICS OF THE KING - rebuking

Luke 19:39-40 - Pharisees
John 12:9-19 - plot to kill
Matt 21:12-17 - indignant
Isaiah 55:1-13 - worship
Psalm 148:1-14 - praises
Romans 8:18-39 - groans
Rev 4:1-5:14 - worshipping

Jesus prepared His disciples not to expect that He would immediately capture a throne or execute the judgments He had been pronouncing. Suffering and more must come first. Jerusalem was not prepared for the time of her visitation. Only the remnant received the humble King as He rode in, while all the leaders of Israel opposed Him. -J.McDermion

4- YOUR RESPONSE - receiving

Luke 19:10 - salvation
Psalm 150:1-6 - praise
Mark 1:14-15 - repent
John 1:11-13 - believe
Gal 5:13-26 - gentleness
Phil 2:1-18 - become like Jesus
