

LEARNING WITH LUKE 19:41-44 “TIME FOR WEeping” P. 1044 PEW BIBLE

Luke 19:41-44 - And when He drew near and saw the city, He wept over it, saying, “Would that you had known on this day the things that make for peace...because you did not know the day of your visitation”

What stones would cry out? Perhaps the famous stones of the temple, of which Jesus said not one would be left upon another. The crowds were crying for peace, but they did not recognize nor receive the very Prince of Peace who is coming to them. Their rejection and repudiation of Christ Jesus will have terrible consequences for them.

1- WHY DID JESUS WEEP? - seek and save

Luke 19:41-42 - wept
Luke 9:51 - O Jerusalem
John 11:35, Heb 5:7 - weep
Mt 14:14, Mk 6:34 - compassion
Luke 19:10 - seek & save the lost
Jer 8:4-9:24 - for My people

This Jesus given to us in the gospels is not simply one who loves, but the One who is love. As rays from the sun, so merciful affections stream from His innermost heart. -DC Ortlund

2- WHAT THINGS FOR PEACE? - prince of peace

Luke 19:42 - for peace
Luke 19:38, 2:14 - peace
Acts 10:36, Rom 5:1 - peace
Eph 2:14, 17, 6:15, Heb 13:20-21

*Only the remnant received Him. Jesus laments over the city as He pronounces judgment upon Jerusalem. -J.McDurmon
The way of peace they did not know. They missed the day of the heavenly visit that would redeem them, turning the day of visitation into the utter annihilation of their impregnable city and glorious temple in AD70. -RC Sproul*

3- THE DAY OF YOUR VISITATION? - His generation

Luke 19:43 - AD 70 judgment
Luke 19:44 - coming punishment
Luke 7:31, 9:41 - this generation
Luke 10:14, 29-32 - judgment
Luke 11:47-51 - this generation
Luke 12:49-56 - interpret the time
Luke 13:31-35 - house forsaken
Luke 17:20-37 - Jesus prophesies
Luke 19:11-27 - these enemies
Luke 21:5-36 - this generation
Isaiah 10:3, 1 Pet 2:12 - visitation

4- WHO DO YOU WEEP FOR? - with compassion

Luke 19:10 - to seek & save the lost
Luke 24:44-49 - proclaim repentance
Acts 20:19,31, 2 Cor 2:4 - with tears
Col 1:19-23 - reconciled, peace with God
2 Cor 5:14-21 - love of God...reconciled
2 Cor 6:1-3 - now is the favorable time

The Lord prophetically saw the proud, unrepentant Holy City as a pile of rubble wet with blood, and weeps. Jesus Christ, God the Father and the Holy Spirit sorrow over hearts that miss their “day” and “the things that make for peace”—namely, repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. -RK Hughes
